


Recently published in **Aesthetic Plastic Surgery...**

Three-Pedicle Reduction Mammaplasty Technique in the Treatment of Greater Breast Hypertrophy Patients With or Without Breast Cancer: Surgical and Patient-reported Outcomes

Reduction mammoplasty (RM) is an important procedure in the management of symptomatic greater breast hypertrophy with or without early-stage breast cancer. We aim to introduce a new procedure: the three-pedicle reduction mammaplasty technique.





a Schematic diagram of the operation design: The midsternal line (from the sternal notch to the umbilicus) and breast meridian line (from the midpoint of the clavicle to the most dependent part of the breast, not towards the nipple-areola complex (NAC)) were drawn. The new position for the NAC was usually defined by the Strombeck method and marked symmetrically at 21–22 cm from the sternal notch on the breast meridian line. However, due to differences in Asian populations, we generally defined the nipple-to-sternal notch (N-SN) distance as 1/10 height (cm)+2 (cm)+2 (cm) or (11.0–11.5%)* height (cm) of normal women in China. The N-SN distance in cases of breast hypertrophy and/or breast ptosis was usually 2 cm longer than normally seen in people to avoid the new nipple being positioned too high. An ellipse with a length of 5.5 cm and a short diameter of 4.5 cm was drawn with the new nipple as the centre. Two vertical lines with the same length of 6–8 cm were drawn by mobilizing the breast meridian. The larger the breasts were, the greater the angle of the two lines. Another two horizontal lines were then drawn from the end of the two vertical lines with a laterally towards the breast meridian. The larger the breasts were, the greater the angle of the two lines. 
