ISAPS 2022 Global Survey

What will this year's data reveal about the latest global trends and statistics?



Pr Arturo Ramirez-Montañana
Chair of ISAPS' Global Survey Committee
Discusses the Survey's Influence on the
Industry

ISAPS: As an annual survey, what do you see in terms of the development process from year to year on how the survey is constructed?

Ramirez-Montañana: As part of the annual development process, we review the newest technologies, treatments, and surgical techniques. At the same time, we can see all the current trends in our specialty, and also analyze how some techniques increase year to year, and by which countries and compare by gender and age.

ISAPS: What progressions/changes do you notice each year and how does the industry influence these developments?

Ramirez-Montañana: According to our results, the industry adapts the philosophy of sales, so profit is important. These survey results support the fact that surgeons can see how their products work in terms of the market itself, while at the same time they can see in what parts of the world their products are used. This allows them to compare their own products with ones being used globally by their peers.

ISAPS: What are some of the most important 'general' takeaways from the Global Survey for practicing doctors, and how can the results be utilized for their best advantage?

Ramirez-Montañana: The ISAPS Global Survey analyzes data by type of procedure, surgical and non-surgical, and which are the most commonly performed. The survey

also highlights differentiation by gender, age, number of implants, and types of combined procedures. For example, we can see how many breast augmentations have been performed using implants, how many used fat, and how many were hybrids (using implants and fat at the same time), this same example applies to buttocks augmentation and other similar surgeries.

ISAPS: As Chair of the ISAPS' Global Survey, what has been your experience in terms of the feedback from the Global Survey results from industry professionals? How has the survey aided them in their practice?

Ramirez-Montañana: As Chair of the ISAPS Global Survey the feedback and the sharing of information between us and the industry, commercial partners, is constant, so it is always changing and evolving. Having the actual data is the only measurable way to know if one's strategies of sales are working or not. At the same time, we can see how fast the new products penetrate the market and which demographic of patients and doctors are accepting new products and technologies offered. For us as doctors, the survey offers solid, tangible data to see where we are in terms of the market, from an individual standpoint, and by geographic location. Our opinions are only as strong as the data we can gather, observe, and share, without data our opinions are not well supported.


