### ISAPS Global Survey: Objectives & Relevance

Disseminating Aesthetic Plastic Surgery Statistics Worldwide



Interview with **Dr. Gianluca Campiglio**Chair ISAPS Survey Committee

As leaders in aesthetics, we understand the importance of gathering data for our specialty and sharing these statistics with peers, colleagues, and those interested in furthering their education and knowledge in aesthetic plastic surgery.

As we observe World Health Day **on April 7**, it is an opportune time to remind everyone of the importance of the ISAPS Global Survey. Every year we gather data portraying our specialty's latest trends and statistics. For example, our most recent Survey revealed that over the last four years, aesthetic surgery has increased by 33.3 percent, and in 2021 alone, we saw a 19.3 percent overall increase in procedures performed by plastic surgeons, with more than 12.8 million surgical, and 17.5 million non-surgical, procedures performed worldwide.

This information allows us to make better-informed decisions related to our specialty and progresses the advancement of aesthetics. To provide more details on the objectives and explain the relevance of the Global Survey, we interviewed ISAPS Survey Committee Chair, Dr. Gianluca Campiglio.

#### ISAPS: What are the main goals and objectives of compiling the Global Survey?

Campiglio: Every day, as highly qualified professionals, we are so busy with our practice and focused on the primary commitment of giving our patients the best standard of care, that we do not have the opportunity to pay attention to everything else happening around us in our specialty. Therefore, the data collected for the Global Survey allows us to better understand our patients' latest and coolest requests and what they desire, giving us valuable intelligence on how to gratify them.

### ISAPS: Why is the Global Survey so critical to the aesthetic plastic surgery specialty, and what influence does the Survey have?

Campiglio: ISAPS Global Survey is the only available tool that allows us to exactly "photograph" the worldwide situation of our specialty. Few other medical branches differ so much from country to country regarding indications, surgical techniques, and demographics of patients, like aesthetic plastic surgery and medicine.

The data collected with the ISAPS Global Survey tells us precisely who we are, where we are, and, most of all, where we are directed. Therefore, every plastic surgeon should read the results of the Survey at least two times per year: the first when it is released to be updated about the emerging trends and the second after one year to see if things really went as foreseen in the Survey.

#### ISAPS: How do practicing surgeons and other professionals benefit from the Survey?

Campiglio: We can anticipate the new trends in our specialty, and correctly being able to address the right direction of our medical training and of course, our future, guide our investments in promotion and marketing. The confirmation, for example, of the great success of the injectables in the world should push us not to underestimate these kinds of treatments in our practice and, as organizers of scientific meetings in our countries, to always include a session dedicated to them in our scientific events.

### ISAPS: What would you say to your colleagues to encourage them to participate? Why is their voice paramount in conducting the Global Survey?

Campiglio: For the Survey to be accurate, it is important that the statistics are realistic and reliable; for that, we need the highest number of replies from every country. It can take time, and we are trying to make the completion of the Survey easier. We are happy to promote participation with incentives every year, but I prefer to think that the devotion to our specialty and the interest in its well-being pushes our colleagues to participate in the Survey.

ISAPS: From a personal perspective, how have the Global Survey results shaped your view on the specialty over the past few years?

Campiglio: In some circumstances, I have been personally surprised to see some results that I did not expect, such as increased requests for

gynecomastia. I noticed a growth of requests from young male patients for this operation in recent years, but I did not believe that it could be the most requested surgery among men in such a short time.

In most cases, I was happy to see that some data accurately reflects the current trends in my practice and the practices of my closest colleagues. This validity is undoubtedly due to the globalization process recently supported by the growth of social media, particularly Facebook and Instagram.

One of the most important messages we can obtain from the Survey is that even though we differ from country to country, by religion, language, traditions, etc., finally, as human beings, we have a common desire of wanting to appear better in the eyes of others, and to feel better for ourselves.



#### The 2022 ISAPS Global Survey Is Open

This is your once-a-year opportunity to take part in the ISAPS Global Survey. It is the only international scientific study on aesthetic surgical and non-surgical procedures performed by plastic surgeons, and your participation is imperative for its success. By sharing your activity during 2022, you will be facilitating the inclusion of your country in the final report. As ISAPS Global Survey Editor, Dr. Gianluca Campiglio, said in his interview, we understand that filling out the survey can be time-consuming, but for the data to be superlative, we must ask intricate questions. We all benefit from the Global Survey, and your time is just a small part of the entire process. We truly appreciate your continued dedication to our specialty, and we cannot do it without you. #### NOMINATIONS FOR NATIONAL SECRETARIES

Our current **Chairman of ISAPS National Secretaries (2022-2024), Dr. Bertha Torres Gomez**, shares her insight on the position:

"We are looking for keen and well-connected members of our Society to take on the challenge of working as National Secretaries and Assistant National Secretaries in this year's elections. You must demonstrate leadership through service; this is a quality required by our Board of Directors for all surgeons who volunteer with our Society. In addition, we want you to be able to enthusiastically represent ISAPS in your country: to help us recruit and retain members, to help organize events in your region, and to promote ISAPS projects like our Global Survey and our Fellowship Program. Our National Secretaries group is a great community, a unique family, and a fantastic way of raising your profile in ISAPS and among your colleagues worldwide."

Elections for National Secretary roles will take place this year in: Albania, Austria, Bahamas, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Ecuador, Egypt, Finland, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Kuwait, Lebanon, Malaysia, Morocco, Netherlands, Nigeria, Pakistan, Romania, Russia, Turkey, and the UK.

If you are a member of one of these countries, please look out for the call for nominees and the invitation to vote.

Once the National Secretary elections are decided, we will announce the nominations for the Assistant National Secretary countries.


